### Biography of Bryan Dunnewald (age 13)

Bryan Dunnewald is from Arvada, Colorado. He started playing piano at age 4 and Organ when he was 9. Bryan started taking lessons from Dr. Martha Sandford at age 10. The first pipe organ Bryan played was at Montview Boulevard Presbyterian Church, at an AGO program called “Pedals, Pipes, and Pizza”. In 2008, Bryan attended Interlochen Center for the Arts’ organ program. (He plans to attend Interlochen again this summer.) The facility houses a 50 rank Aeolian-Skinner/Reuter organ in Dendrinos Chapel and Recital Hall, a four manual Allen organ in their 4,300 seat theatre, and 11 practice instruments in the organ building. Bryan came to Trinity United Methodist Church in 2008. He is now assistant organist at Trinity, and works with Dr. Jim Ruth, principal organist. Bryan plays on the Rodgers organ in the Chapel in addition to the world famous Roosevelt organ in the Sanctuary.
